

Nomination of Mary Conrad for the KAA Lifetime Achievement Award

Mary Conrad is a woman of intense energy and curiosity. She channels these traits through her membership and active participation in historical and archeological organizations. She has contributed immeasurably to the Kansas Anthropological Association for over 30 years, not only through her service on the KAA Executive Committee and consistent cleaning lab supervision at Kansas Archeology Training Program (KATP) field schools, but also through her prolific writing in KAA publications, many of which document KATP field school events. The KAA would not be what it is today without the contributions of Mary Conrad. It is my pleasure to nominate her for the KAA Lifetime Achievement Award.

Mary Conrad was born in 1950 in Emporia, Kansas, the fourth child in a family of eight children. She was raised in Burlington where the family ran a general store; all siblings had responsibilities in the store and became acquainted with the town personalities and their stories. Besides this exposure to oral history, Mary may have developed her interest in history and archeology from her maternal grandfather, Walter Scott Craig. He loved to entertain Mary with tales of history, especially detailed accounts of Anglo Saxon battles. He would often conclude his stories with a philosophic moral.

While in junior high, Mary read issues of the *National Geographic* magazine at the school and public libraries, further fueling her interest in history, archeology, and anthropology. She visited an aunt in Washington, D.C., and relatives in Pennsylvania many times over the years. After one visit when a teen, Mary bought Von Hagen's *Realm of the Incas* to read on the return train ride to Kansas. That was one of the first books that solidified her interest in archeology. Her very first high school research paper was on archeology in Kansas. Mary's first dig was in the summer of 1986 when a University of Missouri-Kansas City classmate invited Mary to join her for a bus trip to Kampsville, Illinois, to dig at the multicomponent Mound House site, incorporating Hopewellian and Mississippian cultures. The dig was sponsored by the Center for American Archeology. That experience was stimulating, and that fall Mary joined three archeological organizations: Kansas Anthropological Association (KAA), Missouri Archaeological Society (MAS), and Kansas City Archaeological Society (KCAS). Her first KAA dig was at Hard Chief's Village in 1987. Mary became a KAA Lifetime Member in 1988.

Mary attended Burlington schools and received her B.A. degree at Creighton University in 1972, with a major in history and a minor in American studies. She received her Masters of Library Science in May 1973 and her teaching certificate in December 1973, both from Kansas State Teachers College (now Emporia State University). She was a school librarian for 42 ½ years in the Kansas City, Kansas School District. Most of those years were at Sumner Academy. She retired in May 2016.

Mary's training as a librarian has been the foundation of a good part of her service to the KAA. She has been state historian from 1988 to present, curating and storing KAA archives, newsletters, and journals. When Mary became historian, the position was historian-librarian, so she also curated the KAA library and took two or three boxes of books for checkout to KAA events, until the duties of librarian became a separate position. Mary continues as the contact person for those wanting back issues of KAA publications, and she prepares a packet of publications pertaining to each year's field school. Currently she is preparing topical bibliographies to be posted on the KAA web site. Mary also fills her car with boxes of KAA publications and makes them available at Flint Hills Conferences and area historical festivals. As KAA historian, Mary has attended most of the KAA board meetings since 1988. Because of her

commendable habit of taking notes at every meeting and program that she attends, Mary often has been a reference person when the facts of a meeting need to be verified.

Another major area of service to KAA has been her work in the KATP field lab. In earlier KATP field school days, former Kansas State Historical Society laboratory technician Verna Detrich supervised all aspects of the lab. Because of the many volunteers to oversee during these projects, Verna requested help. In 1992, one of KATP's biggest years, Mary volunteered to help Verna, and she was assigned to supervise the cleaning lab. Mary continued in that capacity for 25 years, experimenting and refining the procedures for maximum quality and efficiency and minimum expense. Mary has attended all KATP field schools since joining the KAA, as well as most of the Flings, Sprees, Wing Dings, and Certification Seminars. In addition, she has worked on more than 40 archeological projects in the greater Kansas City area with other organizations. In these projects, she has gained additional experience in survey, excavation, and documentation of sites.

Besides serving as KAA historian, Mary has served on the Publications Advisory Committee since 1997. This committee discusses the need for new KAA publications, reviews the options, and makes recommendations to the president and executive committee. In 2018, the committee applied for a grant to help with production costs for three issues of *The Kansas Anthropologist*. Mary played a major role in preparing and reviewing the application.

Now that she is retired, Mary attends almost all Shawnee Chapter meetings. Sometimes she serves as secretary pro tempore.

As mentioned earlier, Mary is famous for her taking copious notes. From her notes and her daily journaling, she has been able to summarize many KAA activities for the *KAA Newsletter*. Most newsletters have a contribution from Mary Conrad. (See bibliography.) She is also an author of articles in *To the Point: Newsletter of the Kansas City Archaeological Society*; *KCAS Bulletin*; *Outfitters Journal: Newsletter of the Missouri River Outfitters of the SFTA*; *Traces: Newsletter of Trails Head Chapter of the OCTA*; *Newsletter of the Kanza Chapter of the OCTA*; *Missouri Archaeological Society Quarterly*; and numerous other publications.

Besides continuing as a KAA officer for 30 years, Mary has been a trustee of the MAS since the early 1990s and has been an officer of KCAS since 1989, serving as first vice president (procuring programs) for 10 years and then as newsletter editor from 1999 to the present. Mary has been on the board of Grinter Place Friends (a state historic site in Kansas City, Kansas) for around 20 years and also has volunteered at STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Math) and Project Archaeology events along with other KCAS members. Mary is a member of the Oregon-California Trails Association (OCTA), for which she is the Archaeology Committee chair, and a member of the Santa Fe Trail Association (SFTA), for which she is the Scholarly Research Committee chair.

One of Mary's many areas of interest is the former Burlington Bottling Works of her hometown. She continues to investigate and research the buildings and business. In connection with bottling, Mary has researched and tasted numerous kinds of root beer and has developed a checklist for the root beer connoisseur. Another of Mary's major interests is bird watching. She seldom is stumped when a fellow field school attendee asks her to identify a bird. Several of her *KAA Newsletter* articles reveal that Mary likes to investigate a subject tangent to something that is going on at a field school. Examples are her research on the arrival of the domestic cat in the Americas, one reason why we find ashes in storage pits (hominy production), and historic trails in the vicinity of a field school. Another topic that she has studied is the anthropology of aprons. Mary loves to visit post office murals, as well as any other murals. She never passes up viewing

them in the towns where the KATP field school is held and has developed skills in interpreting them. Mary is an avid museum-goer, usually spending significant time studying the exhibits, while many others just stroll through. She sometimes reports on her museum visits in the *KAA Newsletter*.

With all of her study and experience in archeology, Mary is a willing presenter not only at KAA chapter and state meetings, but also at meetings of other historical/archeological organizations and civic groups. She has been a speaker for these groups countless times.

At the KAA Annual Meeting in April 2007, Mary Conrad was awarded a KAA Certificate of Appreciation by President Vita Tucker. Although it was well deserved, this recognition does not go far enough to underscore Mary's contributions to the KAA. Mary has had a lifetime of achievements in archeology, history, and preservation of information about the proceedings of KAA. We hope to benefit from her avid participation for many years to come.
